ABOUT GRAHAM BECK SPARKLING WINERY

Founded in 1983 with its first commercial wine in 1991, Graham Beck has an unwavering dedication to farming in harmony with nature and the community to craft Méthode Cap Classique South African sparkling wines using the traditional méthode champenoise.

The iconic brand is lauded among the world's best values. It has been affectionately dubbed the "President's Choice" – the Brut Non-Vintage was served at Nelson Mandela's inauguration in 1994 as well as President Barack Obama's election night victory party in Chicago in 2008.

Founded by the late Graham Beck, the family-owned company continues its founder's commitment to and investment in a wide range of social health, educational and sports programs for its staff and their communities, as well as extensive environmental conservation projects. The internal slogan, "the Graham Beck Way" refers not only to a meticulous attention to the details of grape growing and winemaking, but also to the value it places in putting people and the planet first.

Imported by Beck Family Estates, Graham Beck Méthode Cap Classique wines include three tiers -- non-vintage, vintage and prestige - all made from Pinot Noir and Chardonnay grapes grown in the Western Cape.

VINEYARDS

Near the town of Robertson in South Africa's Western Cape, Graham Beck's 300 acres of estate vineyards benefit from a unique location in a continental shelf, which offers wide diurnal temperature swings, and a preponderance of well-draining limestone soils. Ample sunlight is moderated with cool winds which are funneled into the vineyard area through this shelf. The combination of climate, soils, row orientation and clonal selections produce healthy fruit with low-pH, ideal for the Graham Beck house style: fresh, bright sparkling wines.

CONSERVATION

2000: Winery begins to return nearly 5,000 acres on the estate to its original state. Today, 75% of the estate property is under conservation.

2006: Named a World Wildlife Fund "Conservation Champion" (at that time called the Biodiversity and Wine Initiative).

2006: WWF Champions also develop education and awareness strategies to encourage the entire community. The Becks help launch the Rooiberg Breed River Conservancy with 27 neighboring farms, in association with Cape Nature. Rehabilitation, restoration and restricting impacts on the ecology of the region conserves the area's stunning biodiversity.

Today: 1,200 solar panels power 30% of the winery's electricity needs (40,000 kWh).

PHILANTHROPY

The Graham and Rhona Beck Foundation continues to fund numerous programs which touch on every phase of life and skills needed by their employess in South Africa; from child care and education, to elder care and disability programs.

WINEMAKING

Described by the team as the "Graham Beck Way," the winemaking standards include hand picking and hand sorting fruit; whole cluster pressing; selection of quality juice (cuvée) from the press juice (taille); partial barrel fermentation; extended yeast contact for non-vintage (15 months), vintage (36 months), and prestige wines (60 months). Finally, the date of disgorgement is printed on all back labels to convey bottle ageing.
